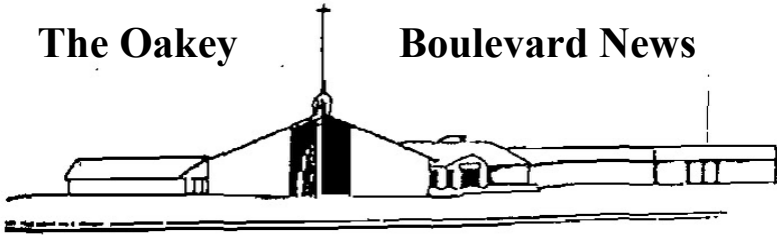

Pentateuch

The Old Testament is to teach us (Romans 15:4). In Numbers 5:1-4 God commanded Israel to put outside the camp all that had touched a leper or a dead body and those with a discharge because they were defiled. God was protecting His beloved. Quick Care Clinics, doctor's offices and hospitals were not available to the Israelites. Those classes mentioned could cause others harm by making them sick like themselves. God wants His people to be healthy and happy so they can accomplish His mission for them. Israel of old obeyed God in this matter and were blessed. Prophets

Isaiah 53:7 teaches us that Jesus went to the cross in silence. Though He was oppressed and afflicted He opened NOT his mouth. That was written 750 years before the event. It is a hard thing to do. Would it come to pass? Remember that God's prophets cannot fail in even one thing (Deuteronomy 18). Jesus was tried three times by His own brethren and the chief rulers and priests of Judaism. He answered them not a word (Matthew 26:62-63). Follow Jesus when others assail you. It is best at times to be silent.

PSALMS

Psalms 129 is an encouragement to those troubled by friends and enemies. It is a victory song. Look at some of its terms. "The plowers plowed on my back (vs.3). A plow makes a deep cut in the earth over which it is pulled. Evil deeds and false words cut deep upon one's soul. The furrows, deep cuts, are very long. That is the reason we are to be longsuffering. We can be longsuffering because God will save the righteous. He will cut the cords of the wicked in pieces in time (vs.4).

(cont.) God can cause the wicked to fail, just like grass on a housetop. A thatched roof is meant to protect the house from the elements. It is not sowed for a harvest of grain. It does not grow tall. It does not give fruit or harvest. One does not depend upon the grass on the roof for sustenance, only for protection. God can cause the wicked to starve. The wicked are not to be encouraged by pronouncing God's blessings upon them (vs.8). Though we do have responsibility toward them (See "GOSPELS" this issue). Randy L. Mabe

Gospels

Matthew 5:43-48: Bless those who curse you can be reconciled with Psalm 129:8. We are to greet, bless and pray for our enemies as Jesus did. Every person can change if they will change. But we are not supposed to treat the wicked as though they are blessed of God in their present condition. Luke 17:3-4 teaches that repentance precedes forgiveness with both God and man. To falsely say that the wicked are blessed of God in their wickedness is but to encourage one to remain as they are, sinful and truly lost. Jesus came to seek and save the lost (John 3:16-21). History

Acts 17:30 teaches us that all men everywhere must repent. Repentance is the act of changing the deeds from wickedness to righteousness. Wickedness is of the devil. It is a sinful way of living. It is not just something that I do not like about another person. It is not a perceived wrong. Righteousness is what God says (Ps.119:138). It is actual godly living. It is not just having good intentions. It is not doing what we think is right. In repentance the mind is first changed. We desire to do good more than we desire to do evil. Then the body follows the mind when the mind continues its new true course. When you find a truly penitent person you see see a truly changed person. Time will tell. Randy L. Mabe
