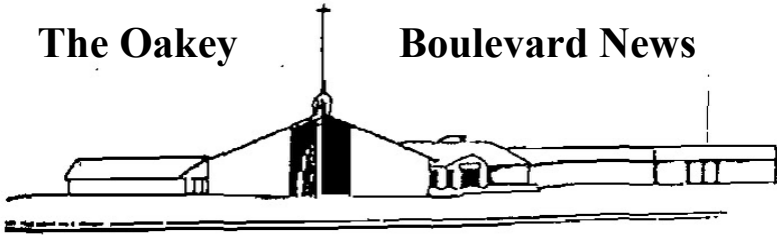

Pentateuch

Exodus 36:1-7 is a circumstance where Moses could say, "STOP IT!" and it be a very positive thing. Most of the times when we need to say, "STOP IT!" it is a negative thing. But here people had a right heart and were doing right things. Really they had done it so well they had accomplished their task and responsibility. And yes, they were giving their money. They gave plenty in record time to build the sanctuary commanded of God. How did they do this? Verse two holds the key: "...everyone whose heart was stirred to do the work...". Sometimes people get angry, jump up and run away from a congregation that has not done anything wrong. When that happens the remaining family has to dig deeper and cover the obligations to the mission field that we all had made. That is ok because those 'left behind' have their hearts stirred to do the work. The Gospel will continue all over the world, just as the sanctuary of old was financed. Randy L. Mabe

What a sight it must have been to see the old walls of Jerusalem surrounding the temple with its magnificent gates. Psalm 51 is the psalm of David in response to his sin with Bathsheba. He was pricked for the good when his sin was pointed out by Nathan. Prophecy

In Revelation chapter five the question is asked, "Who is worthy to open the scroll" (vs.2). The answer comes in verses 6-7 - It is Jesus, the lamb that was slain that we all may be saved.
