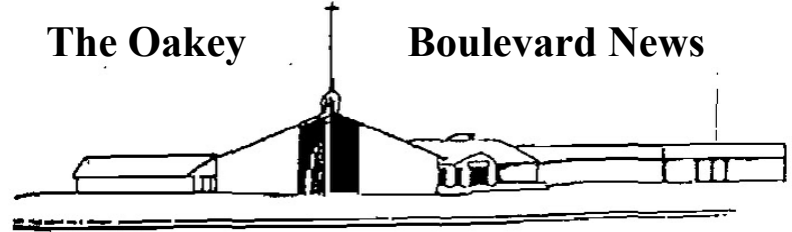

My Joy and My Crown

“Therefore, my beloved and longed-for brethren. My joy and crown, so stand fast in the Lord, my brethren (Philippians 4:1).

Sharon and I are away today tending to family business due to her father’s poor health, but our thoughts and hearts are with you. All was not smooth in Paul’s time concerning the church. The very next verse implores two sisters to stop arguing and get on the same page. But this chapter is one of encouragement and rejoicing. Paul encouraged the brethren in Philippi.

Everyone needs encouragement. The world is full of discouraging words and activities. It is full of terrible thoughts and language. Temptations to do evil abound. Just because someone laughs does not mean they have done well or are happy. Sometimes these things find their way into the church. We need to stand fast in Christ with godly attitudes, words and thoughts so the other kind have to break down the door instead of having the door opened for them to enter.

YOUTH

ETHICS

Ethics is a study of the standards of right and wrong. In the teen years it may be termed what is “fair”. The Bible is the standard of right and wrong regardless what society may teach to the contrary part. But ethics is broader than the command of what is right and wrong. It is the “such like” of Galatians 5:21. There are numerous specific sins mentioned in this context but they are not all that is sinful. All like these are sinful as well.

In business you will hear about an ‘employee handbook’ or a ‘professional code of conduct’. These are the ethical standards that govern how we act in our work - ethics.

Fairness and that which is ‘right’, though not specifically what is stated in the Bible falls under the heading of ethics. If you hear that something is not ethical it means it is outside what is fair and just in that circumstance. No ‘law’ may have been broken but the ethical standard sure was. There really is no difference among honorable people.

Ethics is what keeps members of one ball team from distributing their playbook to members of another team. It is what keeps a professional (doctor, counselor, lawyer etc) from sharing your personal information with people you have not designated. Would it be ethical for someone to publicly post a private note that you had written to your girlfriend ‘for her eyes only’ if they found the note just lying around?

I have done my best to describe and define ethics. It is my hope that you will determine to live your life ethically and not ‘just according to the rules’. Honor is attained by living honorably. Honor is to be given to those whom honor is ‘due’ (Romans 13:7) - it doesn’t come easy; but it is worth the effort; and it brings glory to God.
