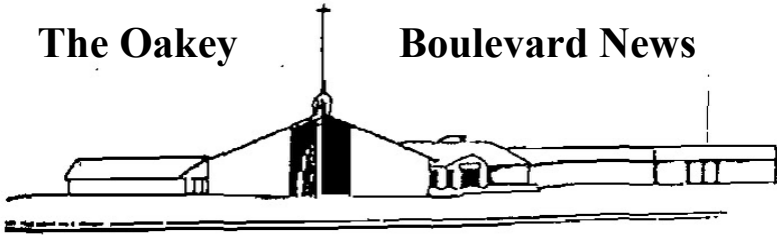

Remember the Turtle and the Hare

Christianity does not have a steady cadence. Sometimes the church grows in numbers very rapidly. Sometimes it is a slow but steady pace. Dangers to guard against are being stagnant or going into a decline. I am extremely happy to watch Oakey Boulevard continue its steady cadence of 'teaching, baptizing, and teaching observance of all of Christ's doctrine' so all may be saved. Baptisms and Restorations are a joy to behold.

In the 1950's and 1960's there was a rapid growth rate. It was the same one hundred twenty years before that. Congregations were being established and new buildings being built to the glory of God in Heaven. Each community is different. I have seen small farms bought out by corporate farms and make a church building obsolete because there were no houses, thus no people, where many houses once stood. I have seen the church just give up at times and cease to meet. Las Vegas is different in that we are transient in nature as a city. We can build hard and steady and stay about the same number as people continue to move away. We learned long ago that we are here to convert and prepare Christians to go elsewhere to teach and lead the church. More move naturally than stay here in hard times. Slow and steady growth usually tends toward strength. That's why the turtle beat the rabbit.

One thing does not change. That is the Gospel and the 'Great Commission' (Matthew 28:18-20; Mark 16:15-16). The world is our place of work (Matthew 13:24-30, 36-43). Our mission is that of Christ, to seek and save the lost (John 3:16-17). Aliens to the household of God enter into the kingdom of God by baptism into Christ (Romans 6:3-4). The foundation of that baptism is knowledge that Jesus is the Christ (John 8:24) and confession of that faith (Matthew 10:32). A mind of repentance is necessary to enter the kingdom, the willingness and action of turning from the wrong to the right in all things (Luke 13:3, 5). When one has so learned Christ and comes forth from the waters of baptism that one is added to the church of Christ (Acts 2:47). Christians who have been in sin must repent and pray

(continued) (Acts 8:22). God forgives and restores one to useful service when a sinner obeys His instructions. Now that is a mission program that glorifies God.

“Once upon a time...” Almost like a fairy tale I remember members of a congregation boasting “almost standing room only...” That is enough to excite any mission minded Christian! But like the fairy tale there was a ‘back story’, or a context to be considered. What if there had been a little struggling congregation that had always taught a specific false doctrine that all of a sudden had a doubling of their numbers? How did that happen they should have been asking. You see a group did not get their way, got angry and split off of a sound congregation with no Biblical reason. These went a short distance to a very small building to join in with those teaching their specific false doctrine. Then they launched their mission program by calling select members of their former congregation to try and get them to follow along. Apparently this is the sum total of their mission work as they continued to only do that. It was not long before the original members realized they were being taken advantage of and were being squeezed out of their own building. This was discussed and there was discontent until finally - you guessed it people got angry and split off again. Does that sound anything like 1 Corinthians 1:10; Matthew 28:18-20; Mark 16:15-16? They started in sin, worked in sin and ended in sin. They did not have to because they knew better. They could have repented and gone home (Luke 15:17-18). But in this case pride held them with a tight grip (Proverbs 16:18).

Paul said even though he was an Apostle that he could preach to others and end up as a castaway having disobeyed the truth (1 Corinthians 9:27). That was because he taught the truth. If he had taught error then people that obeyed that error would be no better off than when in the world (Matthew 15:13-14). Let us heed Paul’s warning and stick with the truth always. Las Vegas MUST have a beacon of truth for the sinner to see, be drawn by, and by which he may find salvation truly in Christ Jesus.
